

## M3 junction 9 to 14 motorway upgrade traffic bulletin week commencing 25 October 2021

Work to improve journeys by upgrading the M3 motorway is planned to start later this year. We'll be installing narrow lanes in both directions between junction 9 at Winchester and junction 14 at Eastleigh, and the hard shoulder will be used as a running lane. This will provide a safe working area in the central reservation, whilst keeping three lanes open during the daytime.

To get the hard shoulder ready for this, preparation work continues under daytime hard shoulder closures, overnight lane closures with some planned carriageway and/or slip road closures. All traffic management for full overnight carriageway and/or slip road closures will usually be rolled out from 9pm and taken off by 6am.

Planned closures for this week are:

- **M3 junction 14 / M27 junction 4 – the M3 junction 14 southbound link road to M27 junction 4 eastbound will be closed overnight on Monday 25 October 2021**
  - **Diversion:** exit the M3 junction 14 on to the M27 westbound, continue to the M27 junction 5, exit and turn around and re-enter the M27 eastbound
- **M3 junction 14 / M27 junction 4 – the M3 junction 14 southbound link road the M27 junction 4 westbound will be closed overnight on Tuesday 26 and Wednesday 27 October 2021**
  - **Diversion:** Exit the M3 on to the M27 eastbound, continue to junction 5 turn and re-enter the M27 westbound.
- **M3 junction 13 – the M3 junction 13 northbound entry and exit slip roads will be closed overnight on Thursday 28 October 2021**
  - **Diversion for M3 junction 13 northbound entry slip:** Join the M3 at junction 13 southbound, continue to junction 14, then join the M27 westbound to junction 3 turn and head eastbound to the M27 junction 4, exit onto the northbound link road to join M3 at junction 14 northbound
  - **Diversion for M3 junction 13 northbound exit slip:** Continue on the M3 northbound to junction 12, turn around and re-join the M3 at junction 12 southbound and exit the M3 at junction 13
- **M3 junction 13 – the M3 junction 13 southbound entry slip road will be closed overnight on Tuesday 26 and Wednesday 27 October 2021**
  - **Diversion:** Join the M3 at junction 13 northbound, continue to junction 12, exit and turn around and re-join the M3 southbound
- **M3 junction 12 – the M3 junction 12 southbound entry slip road will be closed overnight on Wednesday 26 October 2021**
  - **Diversion:** Join the M3 at junction 12 northbound to junction 11, turn around and re-join the M3 at junction 11 southbound
- **M3 junction 11 – the M3 junction 11 northbound entry and exit slip roads will be closed overnight on Friday 29 October 2021**

- Diversion for M3 junction 11 northbound entry: Join the M3 at junction 11 southbound, continue to junction 12, turn around and re-join the M3 at junction 12 northbound
- Diversion for M3 junction 11 northbound exit: continue on the M3 to junction 10, turn around and re-join the M3 at junction 10 southbound and exit the M3 at junction 11
  
- **M3 junction 9 – the M3 junction 9 southbound entry and exit slip roads will be closed overnight on Thursday 28 October 2021**
- Diversion for M3 junction 9 southbound entry slip: Join the M3 at junction 9 northbound, continue to junction 8, turn around and re-join the M3 southbound
- Diversion for M3 junction 9 southbound exit slip: continue on the M3 to junction 11, turn around and re-join the M3 at junction 11 northbound and exit the M3 at junction 9 northbound
